# The Equipper

*Equipping the leaders of RCC through the plain and faithful teaching of God's word."*

*"Suddenly when they had looked around, they saw no one anymore, but only Jesus with themselves"* Mark 9:8 (emphasis added)

**ONLY JESUS!** Is here anything more essential, more critical to the life of every believer than to set our primary focus on Jesus—and Him alone? Easy to say, hard to do. Busyness, distractions, work, relationships, family activities and pleasure do their best in crowding Him out of our lives. We know that's not right or healthy for us spiritually, but we tend not to see only Jesus. He's another thing in a huge crowd of things and we're alright with Him being one of many! Even, in spiritual, church-related things, we can miss out on Jesus—the real reason purpose for our faith and ministries. We can get so busy working for Jesus that we forget to worship Jesus and Him alone. The contrast with Martha and Mary in Luke 10 is an appropriate illustration. Martha and Mary have Jesus as a guest in their house. Think about that for a moment? Jesus in their house!! Martha is busy with "much serving", trying to prepare a meal for Jesus. Later on, He tells Martha that she is worried and upset about many things, but only one thing is needed. Have you been there? Are you there, right now? Worried? Upset? Too busy? There's only one thing needed and you're trying to do a million things. I love how Jesus shrinks our "to do" list. There is a time to work, but we spend too much time doing that and not enough time spending it alone with Jesus. Mary, of course, had the right focus, listening to the words of Christ. Every time we find Mary in the Scriptures, she's at Jesus' feet. I think she truly grasped the commitment of only Jesus! In Mark 9, Jesus takes His inner circle of disciples —Peter, James and John to the worship service of their lives. Quite frankly, the most dramatic scene in the Gospels, apart from the Resurrection. Jesus reveals who He truly is to the disciples. Underneath His hair and skin was not just a man, but the Son of God. His clothes, physical appearance changed drastically and the disciples were taken back by what they witnessed. And, if that wasn't enough, two heroes of the Jewish people show up too—Moses and Elijah. Wow! Talk about a gathering of God's

greatest leaders! Luke 9:30-31 tells us something fascinating! Moses, Elijah and Jesus were having a conversation about His decease going to Jerusalem to die! I think it would have been hard to concentrate being on that mountain-top experience. At least it was for Peter. He couldn't stop talking because he didn't know what to say. Then, to top it all off, a cloud comes and a voice from the cloud speaks "This is my beloved Son, Hear Him!" Exactly what the disciples and we need too! To hear and see only Jesus. Then, it became eerily quiet. And everyone was gone — Elijah, Moses. They saw no one anymore, except Jesus with themselves. What would that be like, to have Jesus all to yourself? Many years ago, a pastor over in England told his worship leader that they were going to have their worship time without instruments and all the technology. His worship leader wrote a song called, "Heart of Worship" for the occasion. The chorus goes "I'm coming back to the heart of worship/And it's all about You/It's all about You, Jesus/I'm sorry Lord for the thing I've made/Cause it's all about You, Jesus. When we strip away all the unnecessary stuff (a lot of it is unnecessary) and just let our hearts and minds see only Jesus, I think we'll experience the peace, joy and contentment we were meant to have. The world promises, but it can't deliver. Augustine said, we need to reorient our hearts back to God. What are you giving your heart to that's keeping you from seeing only Jesus? Work? Your phone? Try putting them down for an hour and see what happens. Sports? Family? Hebrews says to "fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith." What if we really spent more time in prayer, worship, Bible reading/study? One day, all the stuff here will be gone and there will be One person remaining that matters. Let's get into the practice of seeing only Jesus in the midst of the world that tries to crowd Him out!
