Lessons from Christianity from Chik-Fil-a! This coming May, 2019, I will have been out of Bible College for 30 years! Wow! Does time fly by. It doesn't seem possible, but it is. While I've been away from the formal classroom of academia for that long, I have not stopped learning. Life is about living and learning. I am and will always be a student of the Scriptures, knowledge and life. And, it is sometimes surprising where you can discover new things. If we will just keep our ears open and our mouths closed, we can learn a lot. I wonder if that's what Solomon had in mind when he wrote Proverbs 9:9 (and the rest of Proverbs for that matter). Anyway, I'm sitting at Chik-fil-a in St Joe on Wednesday, eating my #1 Combo—a regular chicken sandwich, a medium waffle fry and an unsweetened iced tea! In the booth right behind me was an Asst. Manager and two young ladies applying for employment. I didn't need to eavesdrop because he's talking loud enough for me to hear. What I heard in that short interview was worth at least 3 lessons on what it means to be a Christian. 1. Second-Mile Service. The Asst. Manager asked if they knew what that meant. They didn't, so he proceeded to tell them. He told them about first-mile service in that they took someone's order at the register, refilled a drink, etc. He said, at Chik-fil-a, we don't just want to do that. We want to find ways to go out of our way to serve the customer. To make their time here a good, enjoyable experience. We want to find ways to go the extra-mile—to smile at them, engage them in a conversation, offer to fill drinks for them (so they don't have to ask), etc. He didn't refer to Jesus' words in Matt 5, but Jesus told His disciples about second-mile service thousands of years before Chik-fil-a was around. Jesus said, "And whoever compels you to go one mile, go with him two." (Matt 5:41). What if everyday, wherever we were, if we had that second-mile service attitude with others? How would that change you and, the other person, the environment you're in? What if we came to

church like that every week? Ready to serve anyone and everyone, going well beyond what is expected? Isn't that what Jesus did during His ministry? Serving others was His passion. He said, "I did not come to be served, but to serve and give my life as a ransom for many." (Matt 20:28). 2. Put your own interests aside. The Asst. Manager asked the two applicants. Have you ever had a bad day and it sticks with you? He said, when you come here, before you come to work, we ask you to put those things aside. Leave your interests, problems outside and be ready to think of others and serve others while you're here. Wow! In a Me-Generation (Selfie-World), that's a pretty big request. In other words, it's not about you! Paul taught this to the Philippians. He wrote, "Let each of you look out not only for his own interests, but also for the interests of others." (Phil 2:4). Again, what if we faced life, work, church, ministry, everything with that perspective? Do you think we'd be miserable? Not at all! Actually, I believe there is more joy, fulfillment in thinking of others more than yourself. 3. "That we might glorify God by being a faithful steward to do all that is entrusted to our care..." The mission of Chik-fil-a is not to make lots of money? Or, sell millions of chicken sandwiches? Nope. It's to glorify God! Remember, Chik-fil-a is a Christian company, founded by S. Truett Cathy in 1946. It was built on this purpose. If their purpose is to glorify God; to go the extra mile and be selfless servants for a restaurant, then how much more important is it for us to do these things for eternal purposes? Yes, I learned a lot in just about 20 minutes about the reason I'm on the planet earth. And, I hope you've been reminded of your ultimate purpose here as well—to serve others and glorify God with your life!


