Just Imagine...What 2020 Could Be Like! A year

This is usually the time of the year where people start thinking about New Year resolutions. Many people make them but few people actually keep them. I know, that gets discouraging for a lot of people because I really believe we have good intentions to keep them. But, eventually they fall by the wayside. Maybe that's for many reasons--we didn't really mean it, we lack the time or didn't discipline our time wisely. Maybe, we became distracted or a whole slew of excuses, really. I don't doubt that much of the problem with keeping New Year's resolutions is with us. I remember a piece of wisdom from many years ago, "We do what we really want to do." Meaning, we will put forth maximum effort, time, discipline, work and money if something is important to us. We should never underestimate the determined will of a human being. It can be very strong. But, maybe we're looking at setting New Year goals the wrong way. Instead of putting all of our efforts on what we do or don't do, maybe we need to redirect them to the One who can do all things. Paul's humble prayer for the Ephesian church is just what we all need to accomplish anything for a new day, let alone a New Year. 1.First, Paul prayed that God would strengthen them with power from the Holy Spirit. It seems that everyday, we lack the strength and the will to accomplish our goals, or better, the goals God has for us. Jesus said, "the spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak." What if, everyday as we get out of bed, we pray, "Lord, give me the strength I need today to do what you've asked me to do.? True strength is not outward, but inside is where God empowers us. 2. Second, Paul prayed that Christ would dwell in our hearts by faith (3:17). Since our

hearts are prone to pride and selfishness, we need Jesus to keep our hearts holy and loving. Proverbs 4:23 reminds us that out of our hearts spring the issues of life--what we think, believe, our motives, decisions, etc. Much happens from your heart and we need Christ to guard, guide, teach and convict our hearts to live the right way. 3. Paul prayed that the Ephesians would be rooted and established in love. Love is the premiere, overarching virtue of all of God's people (Jn 13:35)

This love is not a sentimental, fluffy kind of love. This love (Agape--selfless and sacrificial) is to be rooted deep into the depths of our being, so we can love like God does. Everything in the Christian faith-knowledge, wisdom, service, worship needs to be saturated in love. Love can win the most hardened, skeptical and cynical person over, when nothing else can. 4.The last part of Paul's prayer for believers is they would acknowledge the infinite that possibilities of God that He wants to work through us (Eph 3:20). Whatever meeslie list we may come up with for 2020, God wants to do "immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine..." What if time and money were not an object? What things would we "ask" and "imagine" that God could do through us? Overcoming a persistent sin? Reconciling a hurtful relationship? Winning lost family members to Christ? Starting a new ministry or at least serving in a ministry @ RCC? 2020 is not about what you or I can do, but what God is willing to do within us. Are we willing to let Him? Let's make 2020 a year in which we ask more and imagine that God can do more--in and through us. This coming year, let's fix our eyes on the One that's able to do above all that we ask and think. And, as always, all the Glory to Him! Just Imagine! -- Happy New Year!
